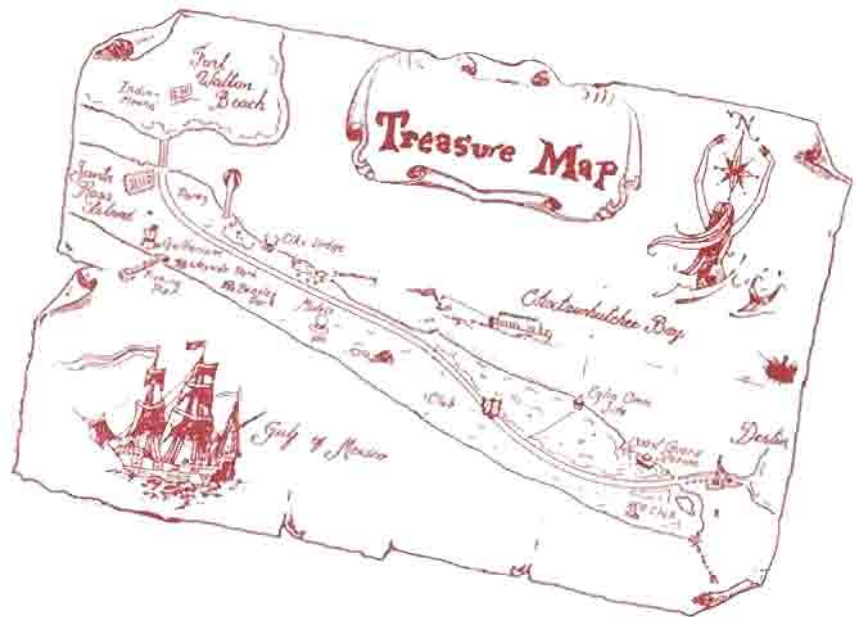
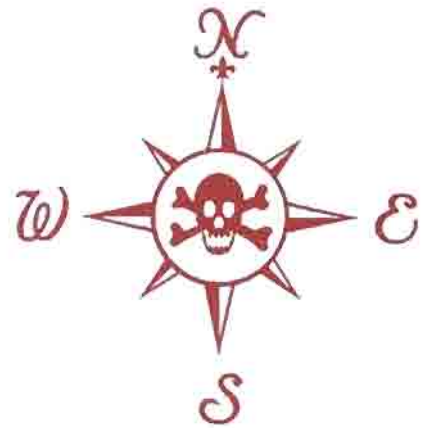

The Krewe of Bowlegs wishes to dedicate this Coronation Pageant to the memories of Captain Billy Bowlegs XII, Dr. Malcolm C. Crotzer, and Queen of Bowlegs XXXIII, Beverly Anchors. Their acts of service and love for life, children, their community, and this Krewe will long be remembered. Safe sailing; we will miss you both.



Malcolm C. Crotzer, M.D. reigned as Captain Billy Bowlegs XII in 1966, with "Boots" Walker at his side serving as his queen.

Joining White-Wilson Clinic in 1957, Dr. Crotzer was the first board-certified obstetrics and gynecology specialist in Fort Walton. He helped bring thousands of babies into the world during his long medical career. He was also a member of the American Medical Association, the Academy of Obstetrics and Gynecology, the Tri-County Medical Society, the Okaloosa County Medical Society, and the Walton County Medical Society. He was also president of the local American Cancer Society, and organized the first free Cancer Clinic in Fort Walton Beach.

Dr. Crotzer was born and raised in Montgomery County, Tennessee and completed his undergraduate and medical school studies at the University of Tennessee. Upon graduation he served as a Captain in the Army Air Corps, and was stationed in the Philippines, where he served as flight surgeon for the 13th Air Force, 44th Fighter Squadron, 18th Fighter Group. Under the pen name of Robert Krasche, he wrote a nationally acclaimed book, *The Hearts Game*, about his experiences in the Philippines.

Dr. Crotzer served as the president of the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce, president of the Air Force Association, and coordinated the 25th reunion of the Poolville Raiders. He was a member of the QB Association, Rotary, Flying Physicians Association, and a charter member of the Fighter Wing Association.

We will never forget his notorious left-handed golfing antics, his annual 4th of July water skiing exhibitions complete with lit cigar and his love for hunting and flying. Mac passed away on January 19, 1999. He will be missed but not forgotten by all who knew him.



Beverly Anchors was the Queen of the Krewe of Bowlegs in 1988 during the reign of Captain Billy Bowlegs XXXIII, Randy Stokes. With beauty, grace, and enthusiasm, Beverly demonstrated that a person employed full time could perform the many social and civic activities required of the Queen.

A native of McComb, Mississippi, Beverly graduated from the University of Southern Mississippi, where she obtained a degree in elementary education and music. Beverly taught in Okaloosa County's public schools for many years, and always proved to be more than a teacher to her students. She was a role model for them, and frequently, a friend when one was not to be found elsewhere. A lover of animals of all kinds, Beverly and her dear friend, Cindy Kabase, formed the K.I.N.D. Club at Max Bruner Jr. Middle School. The K.I.N.D. Club encourages awareness of issues concerning animals and promotes the safety and humane treatment of animals in this community.

Beverly was also one of the University of Florida's most loyal and energetic fans. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church, and kept her faith in God as her priority in all aspects of her life. She spent much of her time with her husband, C. LeDon Anchors, Jr. and his children, Michelle, Laurie, and Rusty. Beverly died November 11, 1998. Beverly's family, her friends, and the Krewe of Bowlegs deeply miss her, but will always cherish their memories of her and her many contributions to our community.

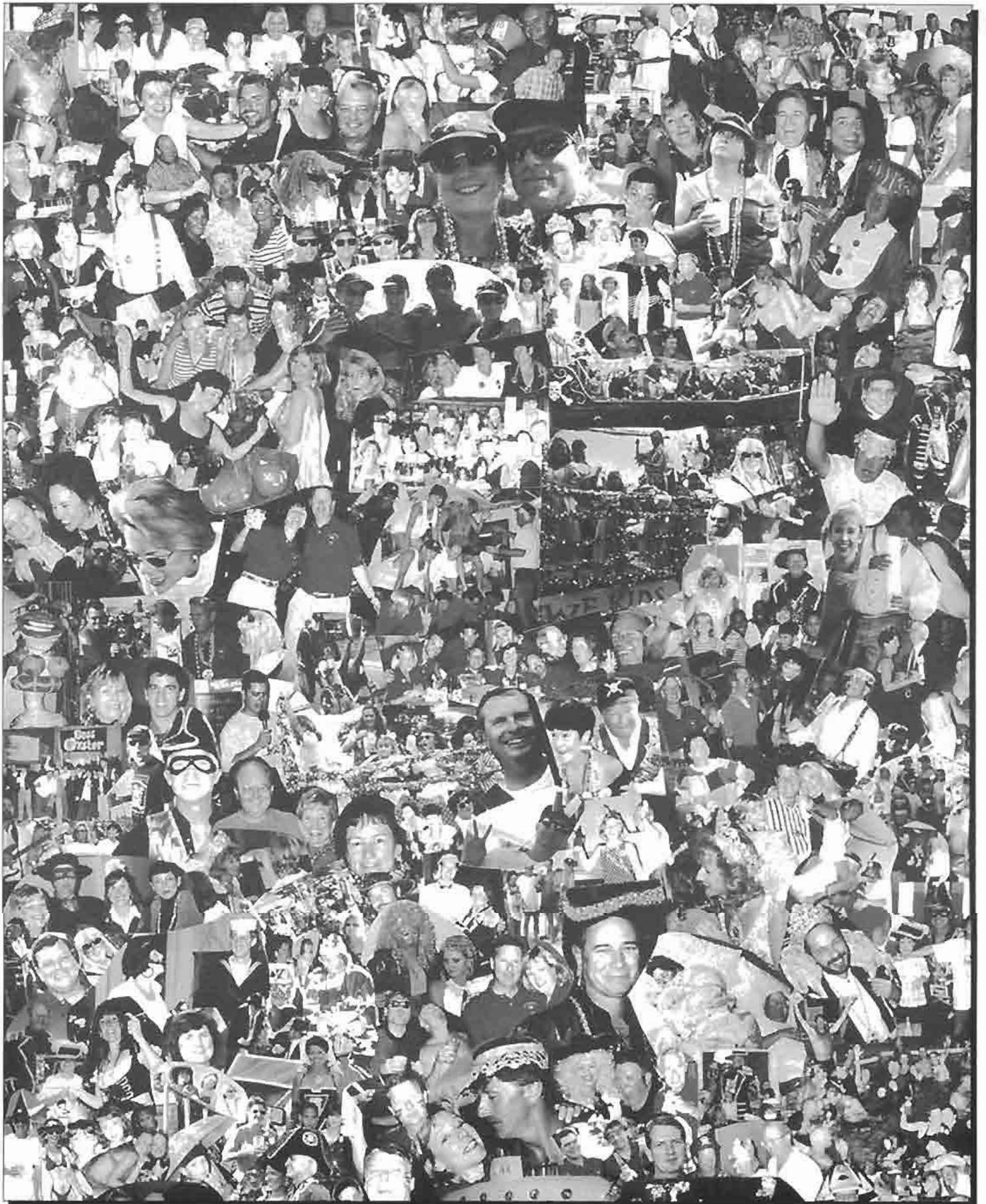

Captain Billy

H. French Brown, III, Captain Billy Bowlegs XLIV, is a fourth-generation native of Fort Walton Beach. He is a Senior Vice President of First National Bank & Trust and a graduate of the National School of Real Estate Finance and The Stonier Graduate School of Banking. He holds a bachelor's degree in finance from Florida State University, where he was a member of the Sigma Nu fraternity.

His civic activities include being the past President of the Fort Walton Beach Sertoma Club and Catholic Charities of Okaloosa and Walton County, where he was instrumental in the planning and construction of their new building located on First Street. In the past, French was the Treasurer of the Economic Development Council and was appointed by the City Council of Fort Walton Beach to serve as a trustee on the Police Pension Board and also the Community Redevelopment Agency. French currently serves on the Finance Committee of St. Mary's Church. He has been a member of the Krewe of Bowlegs since 1980 and since that time has served either on the Court or the Board of Directors for eleven years.



French follows his father, H. French Brown, Jr., Captain Billy Bowlegs XIII, his mother, Sug Brown, Queen of Bowlegs XI, and his grandfather, the late Thomas E. Brooks, Captain Billy Bowlegs VI, as the first third-generation Captain Billy of the Krewe. His wife, Cissy, was the Queen of Bowlegs XL during 1994-1995. Their son, French IV (F-4), graduated from Fort Walton Beach High School in June and is a Privateer in the Krewe. Their daughter, Brooks, is the Queen's Crown Bearer.

Captain Billy's colors of garnet and gold are in honor of his alma mater, Florida State University, as is the tradition for most of the past Captain Billys. His costume of garnet velvet is jeweled with gold sequins and rhinestones and topped with a black velvet cavalier hat with white plumes.

His costume was designed and made by Karen Thornton of Mobile, Alabama. His hat pin and buckles for his belt and boots are made of Austrian crystals by Mr. Tommy Cain of Dynasty Collections in Mobile, Alabama. His pirate boots were made by Huggins Shoe Repair in Fort Walton Beach. French carried his father's sword this year as a token of his father's reign thirty one years ago.





Queen Lynn

Lynn Crotzer Kimmel has a rich and long tradition with the Bowlegs Court. A Native of Fort Walton Beach and a graduate of Choctawhatchee High School. Queen Lynn is no stranger to the Bowlegs Pageant. Lynn first entered the court as a crown bearer to her mother, Carolyn Kearney Crotzer, who reigned as Queen alongside Captain Billy Bowlegs XIII, French Brown, Jr., in 1967. Lynn was presented as a princess to the Krewe of Bowlegs on the arm of her late father, Dr. Malcolm C. Crotzer, Captain Billy Bowlegs XII.

Queen Lynn exemplifies the qualities of the true southern lady, one who's not ashamed to wear old jeans and get dirty, riding and caring for her beloved horses by day, yet, that same evening, sparkles in her royal gown, greeting her guests with a gracious smile. After attending Southern Seminary Women's College in Virginia, Queen Lynn took off for the blue skies of Montana, where she worked for a veterinarian. Her love of horses and riding still remains a high priority today as she and her daughter, April, continue to ride and train their horses, while managing her late father's Defuniak farm. In her spare time, Lynn has served as a representative for the Guardian Ad Litem program, been active in the Junior League, participated in school volunteer programs, and has also been a member of the Deep South Dressage and Combined Training Association. Queen Lynn also stays quite busy with her son, Burks, hunting and playing baseball and football.

The Queen's dress and train were designed by Barbara Ann Guthans of Mobile, Alabama. Bringing her dress to life was Ms. Karen Thornton of Mobile, Alabama. The Queen chose a gown of ice gold dupioni. Swirls of beaded rhinestone braid frame the sweetheart neckline, down the front and back. Dainty tendrils of imported rhinestones cover the shaped overskirt and culminate in faceted crystal drops. On her shoulders rest a collar of French silk lace, heavily beaded with crystal and pinpoint rhinestones. Silver and gold fringe completely outline the curled petals. A deep garnet mantle of velvet sweeps from the back of her waist to form her train. Pale gold beads enclose a large beaded "B" at the top above her royal monogram and glittering replica of her crown. At the base is featured a large, open treasure chest overflowing with brilliant jewels, coins, blue berries, a Florida gator, and sea life. Shields at each side honor her mother, the thirteenth Queen of Bowlegs, and her late father, the twelfth Captain Billy.

The Queen's crown, designed and created by Tommy Cain of Dynasty Collections Inc., Mobile, features a series of swirls containing round tiffany-set stones. As the spirals continue upward, the stones are marquise and pear-shaped. Tiny crowns are formed in spaces in the swirls around the top of the crown. Crystals of birthstone colors represent members of the Queen's family on one side of the crown. On the other is a horse designed in crystals. A miniature tiara, like the ones worn by her majesty's princesses, adorns the front. A large row of round stones forms the bottom of the crown, which is finished in 24K gold plate. Her bracelet and earrings are made of round tiffany-set and marquise crystals finished in gold.

Queen Lynn is married to Bowlegs Krewe member Steven Burks Kimmel. Born in Kentucky, and raised in Pensacola, Florida, Steve is a graduate of Tate High School and the University of West Florida. Steve is a Certified Florida Building Contractor and the President of Ponderosa Builders of North Florida, Inc. The Kimmels two active children are April Lynn Kimmel, 16, who has served as her mother's attendant and driver this year, and Steven Burks Kimmel, Jr., 12, who has served as Captain Billy Bowlegs XLIV Indian Scout. So far we have not been lost yet!

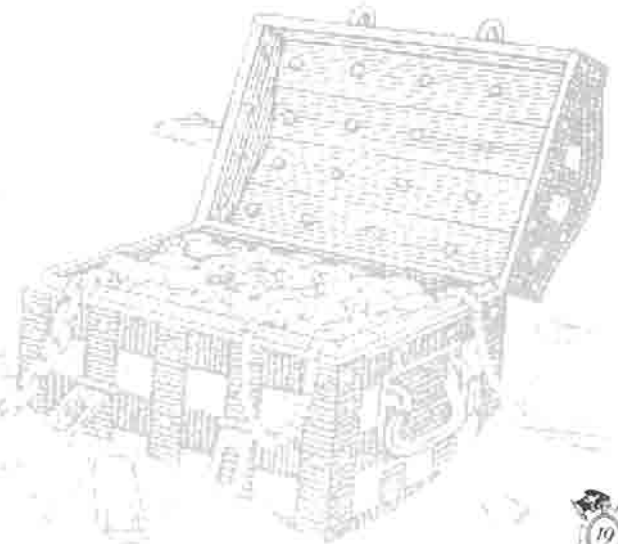

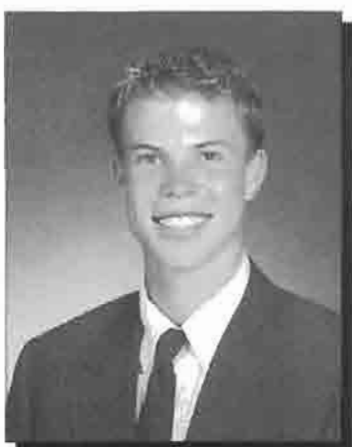

Krewe History



The 1957 Bowlegs Festival souvenir program lists the original membership of 75 men. Today, many Bowlegs members are second generation pirates, carrying on the tradition set forth by their pirate fathers. Roger Clary, Captain Billy Bowlegs II, served as the first Captain Billy under an organized charter.

As indicated by the Constitution & Bylaws, Krewe membership is limited to 170, plus the former Captain Billys. Each Captain Billy automatically becomes a member of the Society of Bowlegs, otherwise known affectionately as our SOB's.

Hours of talented volunteer time, plus sizeable sums of money are expended each year by Krewe members and their wives. Colorful floats, beautiful decorations, and numerous throws are utilized by the Krewe plus custom made costumes are worn during the parades, pageant, and coronation ball. The masked Krewe members shower the public each year with souvenir trinkets, "gold" doubloons, and the crowd favorite - cups.

A new Captain Billy is selected each year from the Krewe membership by secret ballot. The past seven Billy's are solely responsible for the secret nominations. Once the new Billy is selected, he chooses his Queen, First Mate & Mistress, ten Honor Guard men, and the Children of the Court. The identify of the entire court are kept secret until the elaborate Coronation Pageant.

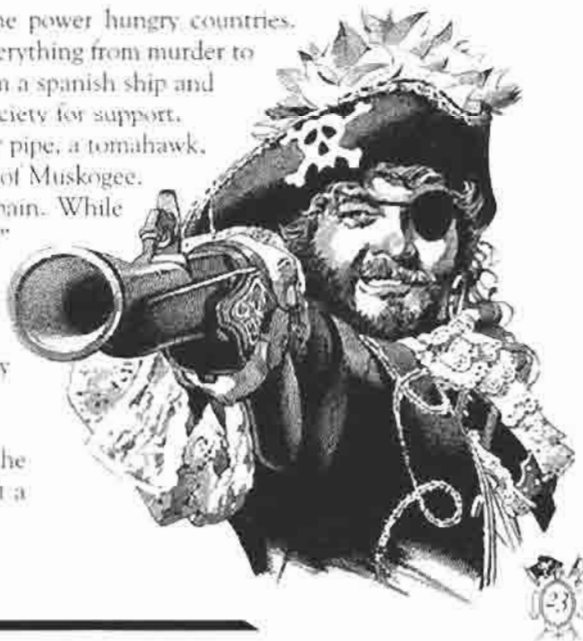
The late Docie Bass, Captain Billy Bowlegs IV, was the first to select his queen from the Krewe membership. Previously, the Queen's were "captive wenches" and beauty contest winners. Past Queen's belong to the Society of Queens, and perform many functions for the Krewe including the annual tea for graduating senior girls (daughters and/or granddaughters of Krewe members). These young ladies serve the court as Princesses and are presented at the Coronation Pageant.

The Skirmish takes place between the City of Fort Walton Beach Militia (Walton Guard) and the Bowlegs Krewe. Armed with black powder cannons and muskets, the Militia perform a colorful and noisy defense when they engage the Krewe in battle on the Sound.

William Augustus Bowles, a notorious old boy, so the legend goes, and patron pirate of the Billy Bowlegs Festival and the Krewe of Bowlegs, was born in 1763 on the Maryland frontier. At the age of 13, he joined the Loyalists Corps to fight against the American rebels. Two years later he was sent to Pensacola to join the British forces. He was commissioned an ensign in the British navy at 16 years old. After the war, he rebelled against military life, insulted a British officer and went into hiding with the Creek Indians, (so the legend goes!) He married a tribeswoman, a chief's daughter, and in 1781 was welcomed back by the British to help battle the Spanish at Pensacola. During that time, the British, Spanish, and Americans were maneuvering for control of the Gulf Shores and its shipping lanes. Believing himself destined to command instead of obeying orders, Bowlegs gathered a force of a "couple of hundred plundering Indians, relics from the American army, and white banditti".

This rollicking piratical crew grew to be the concern of all three of the power hungry countries. Captain Billy created his own throne and the three nations considered everything from murder to a general's commission to get him on the right side. Financed by loot from a Spanish ship and surrounded by a handful of Indians, Captain Billy invaded the British society for support. He was rewarded with a flag of "English and Indian colors mixed", a silver pipe, a tomahawk, a chain of friendship, and trade supplies with which he formed the State of Muskogee. He was eventually captured by the Spanish and shipped to Madrid, Spain. While being shipped to the Philippines, he jumped ship and returned to his "state" and greater deeds of piracy. However, all "good" pirates must have an end, and Captain Billy's came after he was lured to peace talks and there betrayed by his Indian troops. The Spanish imprisoned him in Cuba in the infamous Morro Castle, and there on December 23, 1895, Captain Billy died at the age of 41.

Two centuries later, the memory of William Augustus Bowles lives on in the annual Billy Bowlegs celebration. To the Emerald Coast, Captain Billy left a heritage of pirate tales, great adventure, and buried treasure.
