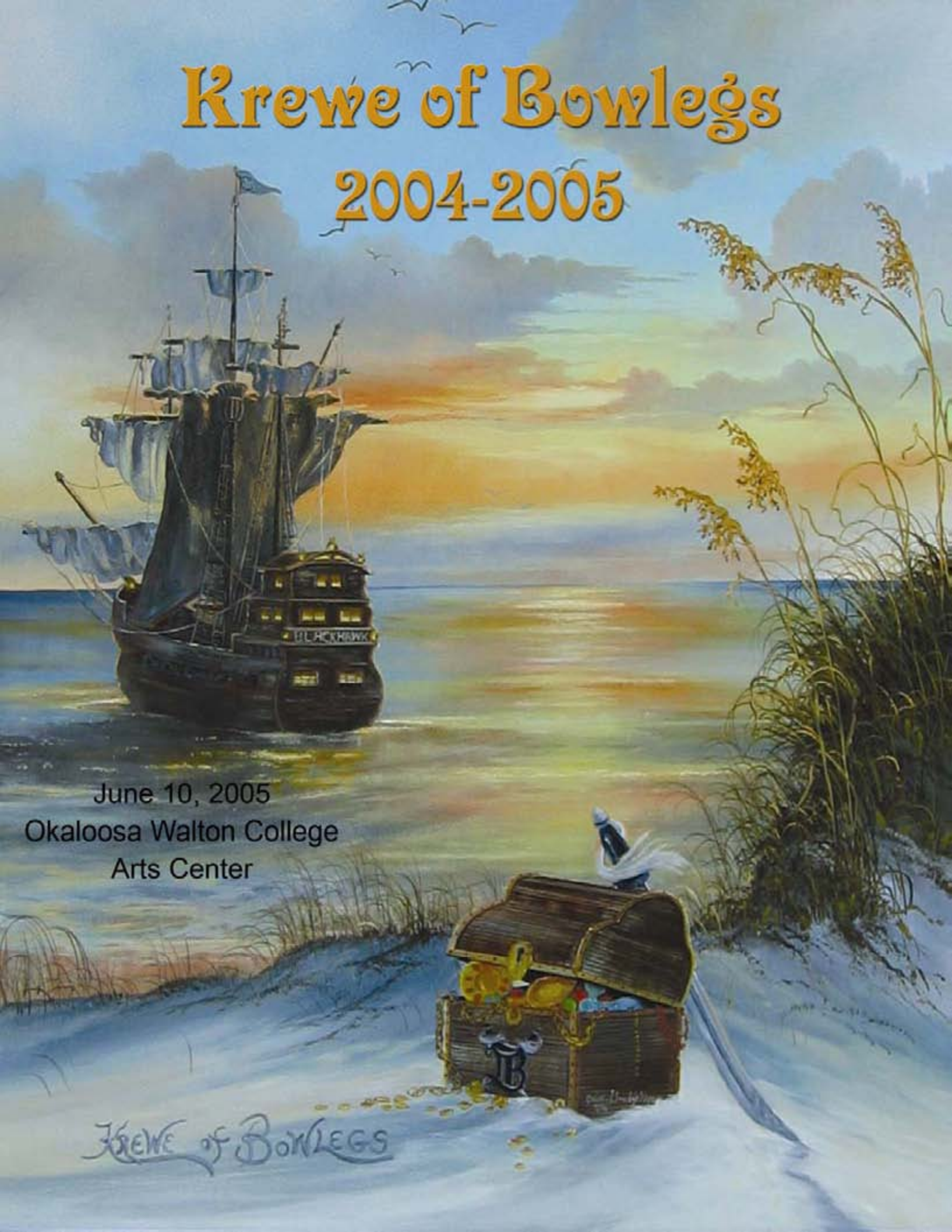

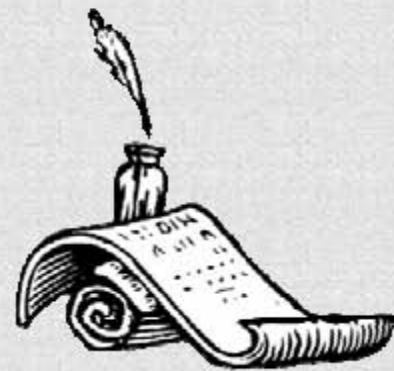

Captain Billy Bowlegs

Tim Ray is a local builder and developer. He graduated from Choctawhatchee High School in 1979. After two years at OWCC he went into the construction and development business with his father. He is the son of Thomas B. Ray, Captain Billy Bowlegs 27 and wife Margaret. Tim joined the Krewe in 1995, served on Captain Billy 43, Sam Burkett's Honor Guard, Captain Billy 44, French Brown's board, Captain Billy 45, Dick Robert's Parents of the Children of the Court, Captain Billy 46, Phil Blumer's Executive Board as 2nd Vice-President, Captain Billy 47, Tom Dlabal's Executive Board as 1st Vice-President, His wife Kathy was the Queen for Captain Billy 48, Jeff McInnis, and then he served on Captain Billy 49, Frank Robbins' Executive Board as his Parliamentarian, before becoming the 50th Captain Billy.

His wife, Kathy Ray was the 48th Queen of Bowlegs and is a native of Crestview, FL. She is the daughter of Bill and Sylvia Brunson. She is a graduate of Crestview High School and also attended OWCC. She has lived in the Fort Walton Beach area since marrying Tim in 1990.

Tim and Kathy have one daughter, Nicole. She is 13 years old and will be in the 8th grade this fall at Meigs Middle School where she is a cheerleader. Nicole served on the Children of the Court for Captain Billy 45, Dick Roberts and Queen Anita Gates as her train bearer. She also served on the Children of the Court for Captain Billy 48, Jeff McInnis and her mother, Queen Kathy Ray as her crown bearer and is now serving as a Child of the Court for her dad.

The 50th Captain's costume is a creation of Ms. Karen Thornton of Mobile, Alabama. The Captain's costume was designed for him of gold embroider black velvet. His frock coat featured deep cuffs of pave'd Swarovski rhinestones bordered by gold beaded roping. The beaded motif is repeated down the front of his coat and creates a half belt at the back. He wears a white Pima shirt with a crystal beaded jabot. Bands of rhinestones form glittering trim at the side of his trousers. He wears a shimmering vest of satin brocade that is gold edged with bands of beading and highlighted by black and crystal buttons. His cape insignia signifies the 50 years of Bowlegs and is trimmed with a band of Swarovski rhinestones bordered by gold beaded roping. His 50th hat pin and belt buckle was designed by Mr. Tommy Cain of Dynasty Collections of Mobile which holds this years 50th Anniversary coin.



Queen of Bowlegs



Jaciel Robbins was born in Washington, DC and has lived in the local area continuously since the early 1960's. She is a graduate of Choctawhatchee High School and attended Troy State University where she earned both Bachelor and Master of Science Degree's in Business Management. Jaciel is presently the Chief of Contracting for the Area Attack Systems Program Office for the U.S. Air Force at Eglin Air Force Base. She is the business advisor and leader responsible for collaborative partnership agreements and contract execution for many of the most advanced weapons used by our warfighters around the world.

Jaciel is married to Frank Robbins, Captain Billy Bowlegs XLIX. Since they joined the Krewe of Bowlegs in 1995, Jaciel and Frank have been very active and have enjoyed many new friendships within the Krewe and community. They were members of the Honor Guard for Captain Billy Bowlegs XLIII, Sam Burkett, and served as the Krewe's First Mate and Mistress for Captain XLVII, Tom Dlabal. This past year Jaciel was part of the Krewe's Top 6 leaders as "Lackie" - meaning "the lady behind the man" - for Frank as he served as Captain XLIX for the Krewe. This year, it is Frank's obligation to serve her with support in her many duties as queen. Jaciel and Frank

have three sons, James, Raymond, and Jeff, and three very active grandsons: Tyler, Keaton, and Brant. They served as Children of the Court for 2003-2004.

The queen chose gold and black for her ensemble to reflect her honor in being selected as the Fiftieth Queen of Bowlegs. Her dress, train and collar was designed and made by Karen Thorton of Mobile, Alabama. Her princess line gold dress features a deep border of glittering black velvet at the hem in a reverse scallop design. The imported gold beaded lace of the dress is posed over shimmering brocaded satin. On her shoulders rests a gold lace collar, bordered by gold and black fringe that is completely hand-beaded. Her long train of gold lace is bordered by black velvet with gold high lights, which is edged with strands of Swarovski crystals set in black golden rhinestones. Gold sea oats are placed in the black base of the train that reflects her love for the beautiful beaches along the Emerald Coast. Her beautiful mask is made of the gold beaded lace of the dress, is set with white ostrich plumes and has a gold and crystal fringe.

Queen Jaciel's crown was designed and made by Tommy and Tanya Cain of Dynasty Collection, Inc. of Mobile, Alabama, and is made entirely of crystals imported from Austria. The crown is a replica of a crown worn in 1902 by the Countess of Essex. Lady Churchill also wore this crown at the 1953 British Empire coronation of Queen Elizabeth, II. Three rows of small tiffany crystals form the base of the crown. Rising from the base are elegant swirls of tiffany and marquis crystals, which are repetitive around the entire crown. Embedded eight-stoned crystal rosettes are interspersed between the tops of the swirls. The Queen's monogram adorns the middle back of the crown, and is resting above the year 2005. The monogram is flanked by a gold "50" signifying the organization's fiftieth year; a gold treasure chest revealing a pearl, representative of the pirate organization. Without a doubt, the Queen and her ensemble are grand and strikingly beautiful, as you would expect for the 50th Queen of Bowlegs.

First Mate and First Mistress

H. French Brown, III, is a fourth-generation native of Fort Walton Beach. He and his wife, Cissy, have a long history in the Krewe of Bowlegs. French was the 44th Captain Billy, following his father, H. French Brown, Jr., Captain Billy XIII, his mother, Sug Brown, Queen of Bowlegs XI, and his grandfather, the late Thomas E. Brooks, Captain Billy Bowlegs, VI. His wife, Cissy, was the Queen of Bowlegs XL. She is the daughter of Lynne Mathews, Queen of Bowlegs, XVI and Charles Mathews, 1st Mate to Captain Billy Bowlegs, XXII.

French is a Senior Vice President with FNB&T and a graduate of the National School of Real Estate Finance and The Stonier Graduate School of Banking. He holds a bachelor's degree in finance from Florida State University, where he was a member of the Sigma Nu fraternity. His wife, Cissy, attended the University of Alabama and is a member of Kappa Delta sorority. Cissy is the president of Sleepy Oaks Realty, Inc. French and Cissy are active in other Church and civic organizations as well.



The Brown's have two children, H. French Brown, IV, who was presented to the Krewe as a Privateer in 1998 and is currently on the Dean's list after completing his first year of law school at Florida Coastal School of Law in Jacksonville. Their daughter, Brooks Brown, recently graduated from Saint Mary's School and will attend Fort Walton Beach High School this fall as a freshman. Brooks can't wait to join the High School of her mom, dad and brother and to cheer the Vikings on to victory as a member of the Junior Varsity Cheerleader squad. Bowlegs History

Loyalists Corps to fight against the American rebels. Two years later he was sent to Pensacola to join the British forces. He was commissioned an ensign in the British navy at 16 years old. After the war he rebelled against military life, insulted a British officer and went into hiding with the Creek Indians (so the legend goes). He married a tribeswoman, a chief's daughter and in 1781 was welcomed back by the British to help battle the Spanish at Pensacola. During that time, the British, Spanish and the Americans were maneuvering for control of the Gulf Shores and its shipping lanes.

Believing himself destined to command instead of obeying orders, Bowlegs gathered a force of a "couple of hundred plundering Indians, relics from the American Army and white banditti". This rollicking piratical crew grew to be the concern of all three of the power hungry countries. Captain Billy created his own throne and the three nations considered everything from murder to a general's commission to get him on the right side. Financed by loot from a Spanish ship and surrounded by a handful of Indians, Captain Billy invaded the British Society for support. He was rewarded with a flag of "English and Indian colors mixed", a silver pipe, a tomahawk, a chain of friendship and trade supplies with which he formed the State of Muskegee. He was eventually captured by the Spanish and shipped to Madrid, Spain. While being shipped to the Philippines, he jumped ship and returned to his "state" and great deeds of piracy. The Spanish imprisoned him in Cuba in the infamous Morro Castle and there on December 23rd, 1804 Captain Billy died at the age of 41.

Two centuries later, the memory of William Augustus Bowles lives on in the annual Billy Bowlegs celebration. To the Emerald Coast, Captain Billy left a heritage of pirate tales, great adventure and buried treasure!

The 1957 Bowlegs Festival souvenir program lists the original membership of 75 men. Today, many Bowlegs members are second generation pirates, carrying on the tradition set forth by their pirate fathers. Roger Clary, Captain Billy Bowlegs II, served as the first Captain Billy under an organized charter.

As indicated by the Constitution & Bylaws, Krewe membership is limited to 170, plus the former Captain Billys. Each Captain Billy automatically becomes a member of the Society of Bowlegs, otherwise known affectionately as our SOB's.

Hours of talented volunteer time, plus sizeable sums of money are expended each year by Krewe members and their wives. Colorful floats, beautiful decorations and numerous throws are utilized by the Krewe. Custom made costumes are worn during the parades, with souvenir trinkets, "gold" or "silver" doubloons and the crowd's favorite —cups!

A new captain Billy is selected each year from the Krewe membership by secret ballot. The past seven Billys are solely responsible for the secret nominations. Once the new Billy is selected, he chooses his Queen, First Mate & Mistress, ten Honor Guard couples and the Children of the Court. The identities of the entire court are kept secret until the elaborate Coronation Pageant.

The late Docie Bass, Captain Billy Bowlegs IV, was the first to select his Queen from the Krewe membership. Previously, the Queens were "captive wenches" and beauty contest winners. Past Queens belong to the Society of Queens and perform many functions including the annual tea for graduating senior girls and support the new Queen in other functions throughout the year.

Sons, grandsons, daughters and granddaughters of Krewe members that are graduating seniors from high school are also part of the court. These young ladies and gentlemen serve the court as Princesses and Privateers and are presented at the Coronation Pageant.

The Billy Bowlegs Pirate Festival is celebrated the first weekend in June each year. The community comes together to put on a colorful, but futile display of bravery in defense of a city destined to be overrun by pirates. The Skirmish on Friday night is followed by a full-fledged invasion of over 200 pirates and wenches at the Landing on Saturday. The victory celebration is topped off with the Torchlight parade the following Monday evening where adults and children are showered with booty amassed during a full year of pillaging and plundering. *We are the Krewe of Bowlegs and we live "In Preservation of Piracy"!*
